



Subject: Advisory on Heat Wave 2019—reg.

Sir / Madam,

I am directed to inform that India Meteorological Department (IMD) has released seasonal outlook for the temperatures during March to May, 2019. As per this outlook, there is probability of maximum temperatures to the above normal in the core heat wave zone states of Punjab, Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Delhi, Haryana, Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh, Gujarat, Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Bihar, Jharkhand, West Bengal, Odisha and meteorological subdivisions of Marathawada, Vidharbha, Madhya Maharashtra and coastal Andhra Pradesh. This in turn suggests that normal to slightly above normal heat wave conditions are likely in the core heat wave zone during the season.

2. The forecasts for the March, April and May (MAM) season, 2019 are as under:

(i) The season averaged maximum temperatures are likely to be warmer than normal by $>1^{\circ}\text{C}$ over Uttarakhand. It is likely to be warmer than normal by 0.5°C to 1°C over Himachal Pradesh, West Rajasthan, Konkan and Goa, Coastal Karnataka, Kerala, and Arunachal Pradesh. Rest of the country is likely to experience near normal maximum temperatures (departure from long term normal: between -0.5°C and 0.5°C).

(ii) The season averaged minimum temperatures are likely to be warmer than normal by 0.5°C to 1°C over Uttarakhand, Himachal Pradesh, West Rajasthan, Saurashtra, Coastal Karnataka, Kerala, Tamil Nadu, Coastal Andhra Pradesh and Arunachal Pradesh. Rest of the country is likely to experience near normal minimum temperatures (departure from long term normal: between -0.5°C and 0.5°C).

(iii) The season averaged mean temperatures are likely to be warmer than normal by 0.5°C to 1°C over Uttarakhand, Himachal Pradesh, West Rajasthan, Coastal Karnataka, Kerala and Arunachal Pradesh. Rest of the country is likely to experience near normal mean temperatures (departure from long term normal: between -0.5°C and 0.5°C).

3. Heat wave mitigation measures involve a multi-sectoral and multi dimensional administrative approach involving activities such as provision for drinking water, temporary shelter, rescheduling the working hours, rescheduling of the timing of schools/educational institutions, use of parks, providing better emergency medical services and public health etc.

Early warning of potential heat-wave events of over a particular area can help to take appropriate measures in mitigating the adverse impacts of heat wave. The Heat wave action plan may be revised if already a plan is in place or a plan may be prepared if not done so far.

4. In order to enable the states to prepare themselves for effective mitigation and management of Heat wave conditions in 2019, NDMA has prepared an advisory to help the state governments. The same is annexed.

5. It is requested to ensure implementation of the Advisory to mitigate the ill effects of the ensuing Heat Wave. You are also requested to refer to the detailed guidelines issued by NDMA for preparing Heat wave action plan.
